THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

Be A Cheerful Giver Like the Magi



Why did the Wise Men come to adore Jesus and offer Him gold, frankincense, and myrrh with all their scientific knowledge? These men of wisdom understood that knowledge without faith in a higher deity, who created life, leads to materialism and death. By seeking Jesus and offering their gifts, they acknowledged that Jesus was the true Priest, Prophet, and King of the Universe. Gold was the sign of kingship, frankincense reveals Christ as a priest, and myrrh signaled that Jesus would teach us the secret to eternal life through the mystery of His passion, death and resurrection. How wise are we to recognize what Pope Benedict stated, "Faith without reason leads to fanaticism, and reason without faith leads to materialism."

The Feast of the Epiphany challenges us to ponder the mystery of Jesus offering his divine mercy to all humanity.

The gift of divinity defines our humanity so that we can offer our time, talents, and treasure here on earth for the glory of God and the good of others. Unless we become

disciples of the Way, the Truth, and the Life of Jesus, we will flounder and fail to understand our authentic purpose on earth as a journey to eternal love, peace, and joy. Like the Magi, we can only discover our gifts when we share them generously with those we love and serve.

Saint Paul witnesses that his whole life changed from persecuting Christians to promoting the Gospel to everyone because he believed in the challenge of Jesus, who said "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?" The leaders of the Church in Damascus convinced Paul that we are all precious children of God and responsible to "build a family of faith in Jesus Christ through Catholic worship, education, and charity. Each time we love, forgive and practice the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy, we become the light of faith and bring hope and healing to our divided world. Jesus commands us to "Let your light shine before all so that they may see the good you do and give glory to God."

Witnesses make the best teachers. I believe more Catholics are losing their faith in God, the Church, and family life because we are unwilling to lay down our time, talents, and treasure for our faith, family, and friends. Our divided society needs gifted-givers like the Magi offered compassion, charity, and companionship to restore trust, hope, and peace. Praise God and thank Jesus for five people who passed on the faith to you and pray to God's Powerful Spirit (GPS) to grace and guide five people to increase their faith and charity.

NEW! WHAT PERPETUAL EUCHARISTIC ADORATION MEANS TO ME

I never really thought much about Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration. It was a curiosity and an admired practice, but it had not been part of my faith journey, even though it had accelerated prior to my mother's death in the mid-90s. Then, seemingly out of nowhere in September of 1999, I became consumed with the thought of Adoration at SMM. During the consecration at daily Mass, I experienced an ardent desire to have Eucharistic Adoration perpetually within our parish. After a series of 'God-incidences', we began Perpetual Adoration on May 7, 2000. Originally, a tiny adoration chapel in the former church was the home of our Eucharistic Lord, and it was glorious! Then as now, it is a dedicated place with our Lord, where so many prayers are offered, heard, and answered.

Adoration is a much beloved and treasured experience with Our Lord where I place all of my concerns, worries, trials, and praises. A place where I could sit on the floor in front of Jesus and speak to Him as a beloved friend, or I could sing to Him and just BE. I discovered that reading St. Therese of the Little Flower helped me immensely as an adorer. She taught me just to bring myself, as I was, and let Jesus do the rest.

There were even a few occasions when I curled up and fell asleep in the Lord's lap, so to speak.

I discovered that the Lord will always greet me and is happy I came to be with Him.

Our relationship has matured over the years, and with it, my love has only grown stronger.

He is available when I am scared, happy, or sad. I have experienced profound miracles and the gradual measure of His timing in my life. The peace and comfort I feel in His presence is unparalleled, and I know

I can bring anything to Him. Being in the Chapel is so different from praying in my room because I am in the actual presence of the Lord of the Universe! Sometimes, it's hard to wrap my brain around that fact.

Over the twenty-one years of spending time in our Adoration Chapel, I have come to know that nothing can happen in my life that is not answered in His Eucharistic presence. I have become more forgiving and understanding in all circumstances. When life smacks me, as it does all of us, I run to be with Him.

I have the joy of feeling my faith grow, enrich and blossom, and I know that is because

I have placed myself before Him, so He may work within me.

Monsignor sent me a note with some guidance which sums up everything. In it, he notes Cardinal Robert Sarah, the Vatican's most senior liturgy official, who wrote "the love that says nothing and asks nothing leads to the greater love, the silent love of God. The silence of love is the perfect silence in the presence of God that sums up all goodness, all beauty and perfection."

So that's it—beautiful silence leads to profound communion with our Eucharistic Lord and leads us to apostleship and blesses us with the seven spiritual gifts of the Holy Spirit—wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord.

How blessed we are to have this great Grace in our midst.

SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD



**Isaiah 60:1-6, Psalm 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-11, 12-13,
Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6, & Matthew 2:1-12**

Today is the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, popularly called the "Feast of the Three Kings." It is the 'Epiphany' because Jesus revealed Himself not only to the Jews but also to the gentiles and pagans. Epiphany comes from the Greek term 'epiphanein,' which means manifestation. In other words, the Epiphany is first and foremost the Feast of God's revelation of Jesus Christ, who is the Word made flesh to the entire world and that the Magi represented the other multitudes of the known world.

The Gospel of Saint Matthew tells how God guided the three wise men to the Baby Jesus by following a special star. A "heavenly" star does not lead us in our world; instead, our stars, those who inspire us, are right here on planet earth. In finding the newborn king, they discover that they are found. In offering precious gifts, they receive the gift of Christ in their lives. In following the light of the star to Christ, they leave with the light of Christ. He even came for those like Herod and others in Jerusalem who would be troubled by his birth.

These days, most can easily identify with sports stars and movie stars. Many of us make heroes out of these "stars." So may go so far as to imitate their speech, dress, and ideologies. Better for us to follow the religious 'stars'—the saints. We take their names and try to follow their examples because they are the stars that guide us to Jesus and the kingdom of heaven.

Of course, some get on the path of the wrong star. We do that when we look down and not up. Consider this example: On a clear night, we can see stars reflected in ponds of water. No matter how dirty the water is, we detect the stars down there. Many reach down into muddy water for their stars only to find out that there were no real stars to be had. People who reach down and not up for their stars are people whose star in life is not God, but God's. The moral of my story is simply this, look upwards and not downwards for your stars. The earthly stars come and go; the heavenly stars last for eternity.

We should reflect on the Magi's journey and how we have come to know Christ in our journeys. How will we continue to seek for the Lord, and how will we be open to being guided by the light of Christ in this New Year.

Question of the Day: Will you, like the Magi, follow the star that leads to Jesus?




