The Church Needs Intentional Disciples of Jesus



Recently, Archbishop Pérez challenged us during a priest workshop to become "Intentional Missionary Disciples" of Jesus. He shared that as Catholics, most of us do a lot of praying and works of charity, but we often do not see ourselves as "Intentional Christians" who make the presence, power, and peace of Risen Lord in our daily lives.

The prophet Malachi warns that God will judge us as to whether we live and trust in the purifying fire of the Holy Spirit or the demonic spirit. Saint Paul converted those who lived disorderly lives and encouraged everyone to practice compassion and mercy. The psalmist sings, "The Lord comes to rule the earth with justice."

The third-century bishop, Cyprian said: "When persecution comes, God's soldiers are put to the test, and heaven is open to martyrs. We have not enlisted in an army to think of peace and to decline battle, for we see that the Lord has taken first place in the conflict." God's martyrs live and die as witnesses of the Gospel. They overcome their enemies by persevering in hope and courage, undying love, forbearance, kindness, goodness, and compassion. God

may call some to be martyrs who shed their blood to bear witness to Jesus Christ. However, for most of us, our call is to be 'dry' martyrs who bear testimony of the joy and power of the Gospel amid the daily challenges, contradictions, temptations, and adversities which come our way as we follow the Lord Jesus.

What attracts others to the truth and power of the Gospel? When they witness Christians who love their enemies, are joyful in suffering, patient in adversity, pardoning injuries, and show comfort and compassion to the hopeless and the helpless. Jesus tells us that we do not need to fear our adversaries. God will bless us with sufficient grace, strength, and wisdom to face any trials and answer any challenges to our faith. Are you ready to lay down your life for Christ and to bear witness to the joy and freedom of the Gospel?

Seminarian Paul Boyer and many parishioners inspire me with their joyful hope, courage, and boldness in witnessing the truth of Christ's love for sinners and victory over the powers of sin, satan, and death. Pray for God's Powerful Spirit (GPS) and Saint Mary Magdalen to help us evolve as Intentional Missionary Disciples of Jesus. Proclaim the good news that "Christ has died! Christ is Risen! Christ will come again!

There is so much that is hurt outside and within the Church.
