Who knew the Church got so excited over doors?

On January 6th, the Solemnity of the Epiphany, Pope Leo presided over the closing of the Jubilee Doors, officially marking the end of the Jubilee Year begun by his predecessor, Pope Francis.

The Papal tradition of Jubilee doors calls to mind a strange Roman parallel: the doors of the Temple of Janus in Rome. Janus was the two-faced member of the pantheon of gods (whose name is the root of the word "January").

In ancient Rome, his temple, which was right in the middle of the Forum, had doors or gates which were only to be opened in times of war.

As anyone familiar with the history of Rome knows, that means those doors stayed open all the time! In fact, Roman historians report that between 635 BC and the

death of Antony and Cleopatra in 29 BC, the gates were closed for all of eight years. That's right: six centuries, and only eight years of peace! Since the doors were closed so infrequently, to close them meant great rejoicing among the populace.

While the Jubilee Year has concluded, we have an obligation to respond to the graces of this time by keeping open the doors of our hearts. The Roman legacy of continuous warfare is not something that has been relegated to the dustbin of history. As we have seen in Ukraine—not to mention places much closer to home—our so-called advanced age has not moved beyond acts of war, violence, and hatred.

And that is why mercy matters. First of all, Christians must acknowledge that they themselves are recipients of God's infinite mercy.

As Pope Francis was fond of saying, *"It is not God who tires of forgiving us, but we who tire of asking him for mercy!"* After recognizing this gift, the next step is to be instruments of mercy for others.

For some, this means forgiving a wrong which another has done to me. Forgiveness does not mean pretending that what someone did wasn't wrong or rationalizing sinful behavior. Instead, it means relying on the transforming mercy of Christ, whose mission of redemption we are commissioned to share in by Baptism and Confirmation.

But mercy is more than forgiveness.

It also means forbearance. The Pharisees criticized Jesus for eating at Matthew's house: *"Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?"* (Matt 9:11). In order to help people see the error of their ways, we actually must walk and eat among them. Relegating ourselves to safe places where we are free from dealing with the *hoi polloi* misses the point. In encountering others, we must actually be there with them. While it would have been easy for Jesus of all people to divide people into easy categories of "good" and "bad," He instead compares God's love as a shepherd who foolishly leaves the ninety-nine righteous sheep in search of the one who strays (cf. Luke 15:7)! Indeed, as He tells the quarrelling Pharisees, quoting the Prophet Hosea, *"I desire mercy, and not sacrifice"* (Matt 9:13).

As Archbishop Chaput once wrote, *"it would be the opposite of mercy to say 'come' and then imply that we need not move, need not step out of our present romance with sin and toward obedience to God's*

life-giving righteousness, the law of Jesus Christ." That's exactly the point: without real mercy and real conversion, the gates of Janus will always remain open, and the doors of Jubilee will be closed. Only when both mercy and conversation are present does humanity truly progress along the way of the Lord Jesus.

In the Order of Baptism of Infants, the presider asks the parents of the child, "What do you ask of God's Church?" The parents may respond "Baptism," or the traditional response, "eternal life." In reflecting on this hope of eternal life for their children, Pope Benedict XVI said this to parents whose children were being baptized:

This family of God [entered into through Baptism], this gathering of friends is eternal, because it is communion with the One who conquered death and holds in his hand the keys of life. Belonging to this circle, to God's family, means being in communion with Christ, who is life and gives eternal love beyond death. If we can say that love and truth are sources of life, are life itself—and a life without love is not life—we can say that this companionship with the One who is truly life, with the One who is the Sacrament of life, will respond to your expectation, to your hope.

If, then, what we hope for is a world free of war, violence, and hatred, the only way forward is the way of Christ, the only source of true hope, whose doors are always open for us to step through anew. ✎

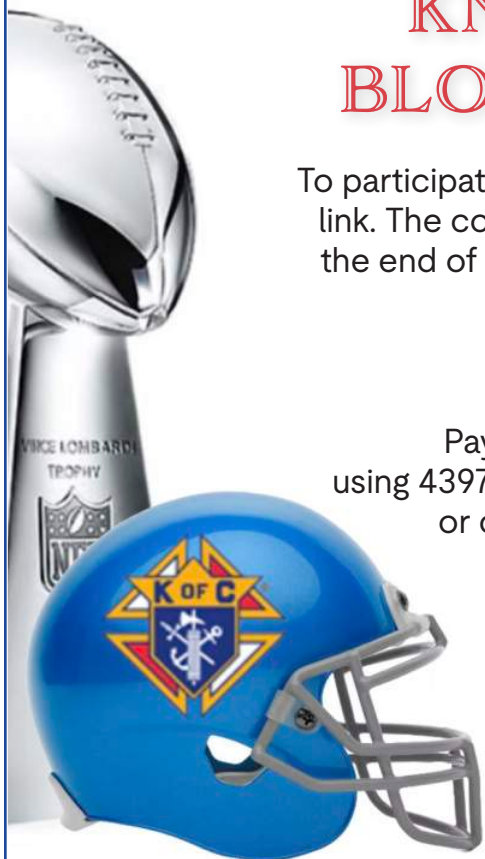

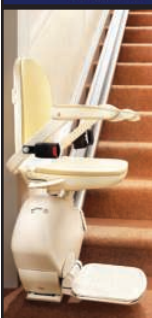
