Do This in Remembrance of Me

The Mass—Part One

Why is the Mass so essential to Catholics? Why do we stand, sit, and kneel at specific times during the Mass? Where did the prayers we say at Mass originate? How could I pray more deeply at Mass?



These are just some of the questions our parishioners ponder, and they are great questions! So, over the coming months, we will explore the most common things Catholics want to know about the Mass. In this multiple-part series, we will review the parts of the Mass from the moment we enter through the church doors exploring all its complete fullness.

been given tremendous gifts as members of God's family, and holy water reminds us of these gifts. By blessing ourselves with holy water, we recommit ourselves to living sacred lives in fidelity to Christ and prepare to participate fruitfully in the Holy Mass.

When we enter our church for Mass, we are,

coming to a place of "family celebration." We have

What is the Mass?

We will delve into this question as we walk through the Mass. Today, let's ponder some ways to think about Mass. First, the Mass is our participation in the one perfect Sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross. Our participation in true communion with God and each other, His Body. Mass is a small 'taste' in this life on earth, of the complete perfection we will experience in God's Kingdom of heaven. The Mass is the ideal worship to our Father, it is an invaluable source of gifts and blessings for us.

Holy Water

What is one of the first things we usually do when we enter a Catholic church?

Many of us dip a finger in the holy water font and make the Sign of the Cross. We make this gesture so often that sometimes we do not think about its meaning. Why are holy water fonts located near the entrance of the church? These fonts are a symbol that recalls the baptismal washing of the faithful (Ceremonies for the Modern Rite, no. 44). In many traditional layouts, the baptistry was located close to the main door of the church. So, just as the Sacrament of Baptism is our entrance into the life of God and the Christian Faith, it is meaningful and symbolic that fonts are at the doorway of churches. They recall our entry into the life of the Church when we were baptized in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, (the Sign of the Cross).

So as you enter a church, you bless yourself with holy water and remember the sacrament through which you entered into God's family.

Sacramentals

Holy water is blessed by a bishop, priest, or deacon and is among the holy things the church calls "sacramentals." The Catechism of the Catholic Church says they "are sacred signs which bear a resemblance to the sacraments" (CCC, 1667), meaning they help us recall the graces of the sacraments. They don't confer grace but prepare us to receive grace and help us be ready to cooperate with those graces so we can grow in faith and holiness. Dipping our fingers into the holy water and making the Sign of the Cross as we enter the church is not the same as our Baptism, when water was poured upon us and baptized in the name of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. However, intentionally blessing ourselves with holy water as we enter the church recalls that day we came into God's family, reminding us we are beloved children of the Father.

As we prepare to join with Christ in His perfect offering to the Father, this first gesture as we enter church helps us to know that we belong and invites us to participate in the Sacrifice of Christ.

Reflection

Next time you make the Sign of the Cross, consider how Christ fulfills His promise to remain with us, and ask for greater awareness of God's presence in your life.

When were you baptized? Reflect on this gift of initiation into God's family, and look forward to your next visit to church. Please know we look forward to being with you in our spiritual home!


