Do This in Remembrance of Me

The Mass—Part Three

When we come to Mass, we recall the graces of our Baptism, genuflect to acknowledge Jesus' actual presence, and find our seat. So, what comes next? A little time for prayer will help us to prepare for the graces of the Mass.



These are just some of the questions our parishioners ponder, and they are great questions! So, over the coming months, we will explore the most common things Catholics want to know about the Mass. In this multiple-part series, we will review the parts of the Mass each week as we prepare for Lent.

Silence before Mass

As grown adults, we may only recall some of our family's rules growing up. However, for many of us, one that stood out was the expectation to attend church as a family. Fr. Spannigal recalls, "If Sunday Mass were at 8 AM, we would line up in the pew by 7:50 AM in my family. It was not to get our preferred seat; instead, it was my parent's priority to be a model for us. The goal of those ten minutes before Mass was for us to settle in, pray and prepare. I often think about what a great gift it was to make it clear that attending Sunday Mass together was the top priority for our family."

How Do We Prepare?

The Roman Missal (GIRM, no. 45) says there should be a quiet opportunity in the church for the faithful to prepare prayerfully for the Holy Mass. Silence offers us the opportunity to reflect on the generosity of our loving Father and to prepare to thank Him in the worship of the Mass. We might also ponder our specific needs by talking to God about difficulties, stresses, or anxieties we are experiencing and offer them to the Lord, asking for His help and grace. Silence before Mass can be a challenge especially if we have yet to make it a habit. Prepare your soul for Communion with acts of contrition and atonement, and pray for the priest to guide the needs of the parish. Pray for the congregation and that all understand what we hear during the Mass. (Understanding the Mass, pg. 38). Use of a missal or hymnal to review the readings and prayers of the Mass ahead of time. Being familiar with these beforehand will enable you to be more attentive and unite your prayer more fruitfully with the Mass.

Intentions

One tradition we sometimes are unaware of is the opportunity to offer a personal intention for each Mass we participate in, asking that the graces we receive from the Mass be applied to someone who might need them or to a particular situation. As the priest prays the Eucharistic Prayer, he offers the Mass for a public intention (posted in the bulletin and announced). Those present can also offer a private intention by uniting with the prayers at the altar. For example, you might ask for your family to grow in love, the health of a friend, the soul of a deceased relative, reconciliation for a strained relationship, peace in the world, or greater recognition of the dignity of all life. In addition to assisting our brothers and sisters in Christ, praying about an intention for the Mass is also a great way to help us be more attentive to the prayers and readings and to receive more fully the fruits of the Mass. Make a plan to arrive at church a bit earlier, and take the challenge of spending a little time in prayer before Mass. In addition to the suggestions above, any of our classic prayers or even composing a prayer of your own is a great way to help prepare your heart for the celebration of the Mass. In our time, when everything can be so hectic, give yourself and your family the gift of a few extra minutes of quiet preparation.

Reflection

Before Mass, pray with the invitation the Lord gives us in these verses: "Be still and know that I am God!" (Ps. 46:10) and "Pour out your hearts to God our refuge!" (Ps. 62:8). Keep these verses in your mind and heart as you bring the fruits of prayer to your preparation before Mass.

Do you arrive at Mass with family members or friends? Discuss the importance of having time together for prayerful preparation and set a plan for the time you want to arrive before Mass.
