

Dear Friends in Christ,

Last week's bulletin went to press before the announcement that the College of Cardinals had done something that—I admit—I didn't think would happen in my lifetime: an American has been elected Pope. Of course, His Holiness, Pope Leo XIV, is not just a Pope for us here in the United States but for all Catholics around the world.

His election is a poignant reminder of the words of our Lord to the Apostle Peter: "And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it." Indeed, despite all the wars and persecutions and scandals, the Barque of Peter has sailed on through the storms of history to this moment. Christ's words have been verified once again. The Church's mission of proclaiming the Gospel and bringing others into Divine life through the sacraments continues.

Pope Leo, as you have probably seen, has several Philadelphia connections. He is a member of the Order of Saint Augustine, a religious order founded in the 13th century which has had a large presence in our local church for hundreds of years. He is a graduate of Villanova University. He was ordained a bishop by a Philadelphian, Archbishop James Green. The Pope is, in many ways, one of our own.

As someone devoted to Saint Augustine, I imagine His Holiness had read these words many times, Augustine's own reflection on his coming to faith in Christ after years of searching:

Late have I loved you, O Beauty ever ancient, ever new, late have I loved you! You were within me, but I was outside, and it was there that I searched for you. In my unloveliness, I plunged into the lovely things which you created. You were with me, but I was not with you. Created things kept me from you; yet if they had not been in you, they would not have been at all. You called, you shouted, and you broke through my deafness. You flashed, you shone, and you dispelled my blindness.

You breathed your fragrance on me; I drew in breath and now I pant for you. I have tasted you, now I hunger and thirst for more. You touched me, and I burned for your peace.

Viva il Papa!

Perhaps the most consequential event in the Acts of the Apostles is the conversion of Saul of Tarsus from a violent persecutor of Christians to the most active missionary of Christ. It is such a singularly important event that the story is told three times in the *Acts of the Apostles*.

Saul was probably born around the year 5 AD. He is described as a "young man" at the time of the stoning of Stephen, but in his Letter to Philemon [55 AD], he refers to himself as an "old man." He has two names:

the Jewish name Saul, common in the tribe of Benjamin of which he is a member, and Paul, a Hellenistic (Greek-influenced) name. He was born in Tarsus, the wealthy capital of Cilicia, a region in what the Romans called Asia Minor (today, Turkey). As the *Acts of the Apostles* tells us, Paul is a Roman citizen by birth. This would make him exceptional - certainly none of the apostles had such status, nor most others. He most likely had that citizen because of his family, perhaps because his father was a Roman military veteran.

Paul, then, is a man at the crossroads: Jewish by religion ("a Pharisee and a son of Pharisees"); Hellenistic by culture (his letters reveal both fluency in the Greek language and deep knowledge of Greek philosophy); and Roman by citizenship. He also has a trade that allows him to support himself: he is a tentmaker. All of this background will be used by Christ to announce salvation to Jews and Gentiles. But first, Jesus would have to get Paul's attention. As Flannery O'Connor, the great American Catholic author, said of him, "I reckon the Lord knew the only way to make a Christian out of that one was to knock him off his horse."

He studied Torah under Gamaliel, a famous rabbi we meet in the Sanhedrin as an old man, in the late 20s or early 30s. In other words, Paul is highly educated

in the Jewish faith and is utterly convinced of its rightness and of the evil threat that Christianity poses to the covenant community of Israel. He aggressively pursues the arrest and murder of Christians like Saint Stephen. Then one day, something amazing happens, an event recounted in Acts 9, Acts 22, and again in Acts 26. Here is the version from Acts 9:

Now Saul, still breathing murderous threats against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest and asked him for letters to the synagogues in Damascus, that, if he should find any men or women who belonged to the Way, he might bring them back to Jerusalem in chains. On his journey, as he was near Damascus, a light from the sky suddenly flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice saying, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?" He said, "Who are you, sir?"

The reply came, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do." The men who were traveling with him stood speechless, for they heard the voice but could see no one.

Paul would later describe this event as a special, utterly unique appearance of the risen Christ, equivalent in every way to his post-Resurrection appearance to the apostles. Of course, this happens years, not weeks, after the Resurrection (*probably in 36 AD*), which is why he will describe his conversion as the coming into the world of "one untimely born" (1 Cor 15:8).

Having revealed himself to Paul in this way, Jesus will commission Paul to redirect all that energy he used in persecuting the Church to becoming the greatest evangelist of all, the "apostle to the Gentiles." His missionary journeys, still unparalleled in the history of the Church, will truly take the Gospel to the ends of the earth, even as that mission continues in our own day.

Luke and Acts are really the first and second volumes of a two-volume work. They are meant to be read together. In that light, we can look at the Lord's call to a Christian named Ananias, who receives a very unexpected job:

The Lord said to him, "Get up and go to the street called Straight and ask at the house of Judas for a man from Tarsus named Saul. He is there praying, and [in a vision] he has seen a man named Ananias come in and lay [his] hands on him, that he may regain his sight." But Ananias replied, "Lord, I have heard from many sources about this man, what evil things he has done to your holy ones* in Jerusalem. And here he has authority from the chief priests to imprison all who call upon your name." But the Lord said to him, "Go, for this man is a chosen instrument of mine to carry my name before Gentiles, kings, and Israelites, and I will show him what he will have to suffer for my name." So Ananias went and entered the house; laying his hands on him, he said, "Saul, my brother, the Lord has sent me, Jesus who appeared to you on the way by which you came, that you may regain your sight and be filled with the holy Spirit."

In Luke 4, Jesus announces the beginning of his public ministry at the synagogue in his hometown of Nazareth. There, he announces that, in fulfillment of the prophecy of Isaiah, the Father has sent him to announce the "recovery of sight to the blind." In Paul of Tarsus, the faith born of an encounter with the risen Lord Jesus leads to baptism, which heals him not just of temporary physical blindness, but of the spiritual blindness that has warped his heart. Now, freed physically and spiritually of these afflictions, he is ready to be the "chosen instrument" of the Gospel.
