Toward the beginning of the famous document *Rerum Novarum*, Pope Leo XIII laid out its purpose and aim: "to define the relative rights and mutual duties of the rich and of the poor, of capital and of labor." Indeed, it is not the job of the Church to effect decisions in the political and economic

sphere. However, she has the right and duty to lay down principles of justice and morality that prevail in any situation and place in which she finds herself. That is why the document is addressed not to the public at large but to "Our Venerable Brethren, the Patriarchs, Primates, Archbishops, Bishops, and other ordinaries

of places having peace and communion with the Apostolic See." In other words, the Pope is not some oracle who can address himself to the whole world and expect them to carry out his will. Instead, his aim is to inform those who bear pastoral responsibilities in their local churches about the grave issues at stake and what the Church's wisdom can offer in response. It is for them, in turn, to form the faithful in their own communities, particularly those with some ability to bring about needed changes.

I would like to highlight three elements from the first sections of the document which might surprise us today. The first is Leo's understanding of the role of salary and wages in commerce. He begins by condemning the notion—advocated by the Socialists—of getting rid of private property entirely. He calls this manifestly unjust. But then he goes on to say why: "It is surely undeniable that, when a man engages in remunerative labor, the impelling reason and motive of his work is to obtain property, and thereafter to hold it as his very own" (RN 5). Leo says that making property owned by the collective rather than private individuals is a crime against working people who, by collecting wages and living frugally, are able to provide for their material needs and acquire property for himself. In other words, a wage earner is supposed to become a property owner, one who has land (in an agrarian context) or some other combination of capital and skill by which he can earn his own living in a free and independent way. No one, implies Leo, is meant to work at the behest of some wealthy man indefinitely. That would be an injustice.

Rather, the employer has a duty to pay a just and reasonable wage to allow the person to acquire the knowledge, savings, and skills necessary to have his own means of providing for himself and his family, thus "bettering his condition in life."

Is that how we see things today? Perhaps not, but then again, perhaps we should. While our country often holds up famous (and/or infamous) public figures who have amassed great fortunes through massively lucrative businesses (think Rockefeller, Carnegie, Ford, Gates, Jobs, Musk, Bezos, et al.), a much more reasonable way of life is the person who operates a small business (or farm) that allows for the support of one's family and the benefit of society by providing

some kind of goods or services. To young adults in particular, this is an important reminder that should not be ignored: the goal of one's career is not to be dependent upon a salary given by a large company indefinitely but to allow such to be a temporary stop toward the fuller use of one's creative energies in an organization in which one has much closer ownership and investment. (Today, this can take the form of small business partnerships and Employee Stock Ownership Plans (ESOPs), among other initiatives.)

Why does Leo emphasize this? Not because he cares about people becoming rich. We know what Jesus said in the Gospels about that ("It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the Kingdom of God," Matt 19:24). Rather, it is for the sake of the dignity of the family, which is the vital cell of society and has the first claim to the concern of the wider community. He calls the family household a "true society and one older than any State." For this reason, he says, "it has rights and duties peculiar to itself which are quite independent of the State" (12).

This is the absolute right of the family to live in tranquility and peace without interference from political or economic considerations—is the center of Leo's message. The State cannot make all property communally owned because the family is more important than the State and has the proper claim to the land and property where they live. A company cannot pay someone such small wages that the family cannot possibly hope to acquire land and property for itself—that would be a sin against the virtue of justice. Rather, a wage earner who lives in a simple way should, over time, be able, says Pope Leo XIII, to acquire property, which can be the basis of the family's freedom and independence, necessary for their full flourishing and that of the wider community.

We might contend that life has changed a great deal, and very few people live off the land anymore. That is true, though the buying out of huge tracts of agricultural land by large multinationals is something the Church has been concerned about for some time. This is why supporting local farms is a good thing. (I would like to bring some of our youth-aged parishioners to visit a Catholic farm run by a Catholic couple later this year.) However, that said, most people don't have the ability to earn their living by running a farm anymore. They can, however, purchase a home which is the family's own and even—in time—start or join in a (small) business venture by which the family's financial resources can be properly provided.

Along this same vein, Leo contends that the State should not insert itself into family life in any way except for cases of extreme destitution or some grave abuse within the family itself. Even public financial aid (welfare) must be an absolute last resort, so that the State does not assume even accidentally the parental duty of providing for the family. That link between Socialist economic theory and the abolition of the family is clear in the writings of Marx—and so Leo wants society to avoid both. At the same time, this can only happen if the capitalist system is properly understood and regulated—by government policy as needed, but much more by the moral principles of justice and the Great Commandment of love.

We have seen in the 125 years since this document was published, the continual collection of wealth in the hands of a relative few, the increased dependence of families on earning wages (even as they have increased), and the breakdown of family life through the proliferation of divorce, contraception, abortion, and erroneous understandings of the nature of marriage. In other words, Leo was quite right to warn the world about the parallel dangers of a capitalist economy, unchecked by moral virtue, leading to a breakdown in those essential human relationships.

It is for us to learn these lessons anew and begin again, armed with the Church's perennial wisdom and the grace of the Holy Spirit who moves the lay faithful to make Christ present in every field of human endeavor. ☸






