**NEW! GRIEVING DURING THE CHRISTMAS SEASON**

Many of us are filled with joy during the Christmas season. However, for others it is filled with sadness because of the death of a loved one. I can remember when my wife, of twenty-eight years, passed of cancer, and I had three children to raise. Christmas was immensely sad for my children and me, and I did not know how to function. Moreover, I did not know how to cook, do the laundry, and many other things my wife handled. I wished someone would have told me how to cope during the most difficult time of my life.

I resolved that if I ever got over all of these issues, I would do my best to help those in a similar situation. If you are in grief, chances are, you are not going to have a joyful Christmas. As a result, you should try to adjust your expectations. Reasonable goals may aid you in making your Christmas more tolerable. Consider the following:

**Get Rest:** You are undergoing the equivalent of a heart attack, and like anyone who endures a heart attack, you will need respite and quiet. Create some time for self-care or a self-health day.

**Watch what you eat and drink:** There is a strong tendency to quell your sadness by eating junk food, using excessive drugs or alcohol.

**Exercise.** Exercise helps to relieve stress, so try some walks. Light exercise and fresh air may help to alleviate some of your anxiety.

**Build yourself up emotionally:** Do not be too hard yourself. Have confidence that you can do or learn things. If you do not know how to do something, ask for help. Friends are glad to have an opportunity to support you, so speak to your friends. Buy something nice for yourself. Be sure to take some time alone and with others who can help you.

**Consider new traditions:** Plan ahead to determine what you can and cannot do. Do something different than you did last year. Discuss with your family who is doing what this is the year, so you are not be overdoing anything. Let others take part in the workload. Don't set a place at the table for the loved one. It will make the day more difficult. Consider a buffet-style dinner instead of sitting around a table. You could also consider having dinner at someone else's house.

**Christmas cards:** Skip the Christmas cards. It is okay to send just a few or none at all. Everyone will understand that you were not up for it.

**Invitations:** If you get invited to a party or any other social event, do not be afraid to say no. Only attend if you know you will feel comfortable. Generally, it is a bad idea to go to a wedding or an event where there will be a lot of singing or dancing.

**Shopping:** Keep your shopping to a minimum and avoid crowded malls, consider online shopping instead.

**It is alright to cry:** Tears help relieve anxiety, so let the tears flow.

**It is okay to be happy:** Your loved one would want you to be at peace and happy. It is not disrespectful to your loved one. It is healthy to take a break from your sadness.

**Try journaling:** Some find it helpful to write their thoughts and feelings down. Handwriting out your thoughts may be even more therapeutic than typing on a computer.

Let Christmas be the beginning of a new version of yourself. Spend time thinking about Christmas more than you ever did before. Your loved one is enjoying Christ's birthday in heaven. What a special gift!

**THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT**

**Micah 5:1-4a, Psalm 80:2-3, 15-16, 18-19,  
Hebrews 10:5-10, & Luke 1:39-45**

**Reflection by Deacon Anthony Cincotta**

*In the fast-paced and sometimes scary world we live in, a Today, on this last Sunday before Christmas, our Gospel narrative prepares us to witness Christ's birth by showing us how Jesus was recognized as Israel's long-awaited Messiah, even before His actual birth. Saint Luke turns our attention from the ministry of John the Baptist to the events that preceded John's birth. The story of John the Baptist and his parents, Elizabeth, and Zechariah are reported only in Luke's Gospel. Luke pairs the birth of John the Baptist and Jesus, establishing John's early connection to the Messiah.*

*The Gospel reading recalls Mary's actions after the announcement of Jesus' birth by the angel Gabriel. Mary decides to visit Elizabeth, her cousin, also expecting a child. Elizabeth greets Mary with full recognition of the roles that they and their unborn children will play in God's plan for salvation. If we were to continue to read the verses that follow in Luke's narrative, we would hear Mary respond to Elizabeth's greeting with her song of praise, the Magnificat. Both women recall and echo God's history of showing favor upon the people of Israel.*


*Saint Luke describes how the Holy Spirit helps reveal Jesus' identity as God to those who believe. Elizabeth is filled with the Holy Spirit and sings Mary's praise because she carries the Lord in her womb. We sing these words of praise to Mary in the Hail Mary. Even John, the unborn child in Elizabeth's womb, is said to recognize the presence of the Lord and leaps for joy.*

*Dear friends, it is appropriate in this season of Advent that we consider the role of Mary in God's plan of salvation. Elizabeth describes Mary as the first disciple, as the one who believed that God's Word to her would be fulfilled. Mary's faith enabled her to recognize the work of God in her people's history and her own life. Her openness to God allowed God to work through her so that salvation might come to everyone. As a result, Mary, our Blessed Mother, is a model and symbol of the Church. May we be like Mary, open and cooperative in God's plan for salvation.*

**Question of the Day:** How will you 'leap for joy' as the baby Jesus enters your home on Christmas morning?

**Prayer:** Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord.  
May it be done to me according to Your Word.


### ST. VINCENT DE PAUL NEWS
