## Our Blessed Mother Prepares Our Hearts for the Joy of Jesus



In 1498 with three ships, the *Nina (infant)*, *Pinta (painting)*, and the *Santa Maria (Blessed Mary)*, Christopher Columbus discovered America. Later, Columbus brought priests to convert the natives, but they experienced little success. In December 1531, Our Lady appeared to Juan Diego, a recent convert who walked many miles to attend Mass in Mexico, asking for a church to be built in her honor. His bishop requested a sign from Juan Diego, and our Blessed Mother told him to bring a bundle of roses to the bishop. When he opened his cloak (*tilma*) with the roses, the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe appeared. This image depicts our Holy Mary pregnant with the infant Jesus. This miracle increased the conversion of nine million Mexicans to the Catholic faith within a decade. To this day, millions of pilgrims continue to pray before the 'Tilma' for healing and holiness.

**The miraculous wonders of this image amaze all of us by revealing the graces flowing from Our Blessed Mother.**

Scientists discovered that Juan Diego is offering the roses to the bishop reflected in Our Lady's eyes. We are blessed to uncover this discovery in our time, which is all in God's

Providential design. How desperately we need to be witness for those doubting our faith that we have Our Mother gazing upon us, praying for us, and leading us to her Son! Do you believe our Heavenly Mother beholds us and intercedes for us to unite our minds and hearts to Jesus?

**Jesus is truly God and truly human because the Holy Spirit impregnated Mary.** Through the Incarnation, we unite our minds and hearts with the hearts of Jesus and Mary, who empower us to promote divine life, love, and peace. Like, Mary, we must be available to God's will, ready to offer our time, talents, and resources to love and forgive like Jesus. As Mother of the Church, Mary invites us to live a sacramental life. Baptism restores our divine dignity as precious sons and daughters of God. Reconciliation renews our friendship when we sin by calling upon his mercy. Confirmation empowers us to be strong, loving, and wise in our battle with sin and Satan. Holy Communion nourishes us to practice the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy. In a time of sickness, the Holy Spirit anoints us with grace to heal or trust in the blessings of eternal life. Expect miracles of love, peace, and joy by uniting your hearts to the hearts of Jesus and Mary.

**NEW! PERPETUAL EUCHARISTIC ADORATION  
AND WHAT IS MEANS TO ME**

I never really thought much about Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration. It was a curiosity and an admired practice, but it had not been part of my faith journey, even though it had accelerated prior to my mother's death in the mid-90s. Then, seemingly out of nowhere in September of 1999, I became consumed with the thought of Adoration at SMM. During the consecration at daily Mass, I experienced an ardent desire to have Eucharistic Adoration perpetually within our parish.

After a series of 'God-incidences', we began Perpetual Adoration on May 7, 2000. Originally, a tiny adoration chapel in the former church was the home of our Eucharistic Lord, and it was glorious!

Then as now, it is a dedicated place with our Lord, where so many prayers are offered, heard, and answered.

Adoration is a much beloved and treasured experience with Our Lord where I place all of my concerns, worries, trials, and praises. A place where I could sit on the floor in front of Jesus and speak to Him as a beloved friend, or I could sing to Him and just BE.

I discovered that reading St. Therese of the Little Flower helped me immensely as an adorer. She taught me just to bring myself, as I was, and let Jesus do the rest. There were even a few occasions when I curled up and fell asleep in the Lord's lap, so to speak. I discovered that the Lord will always greet me and is happy I came to be with Him.

Our relationship has matured over the years, and with it, my love has only grown stronger. He is available when I am scared, happy, or sad.

I have experienced profound miracles and the gradual measure of His timing in my life. The peace and comfort I feel in His presence is unparalleled, and I know I can bring anything to Him. Being in the Chapel is so different from praying in my room because I am in the actual presence of the Lord of the Universe! Sometimes, it's hard to wrap my brain around that fact.

Over the twenty-one years of spending time in our Adoration Chapel, I have come to know that nothing can happen in my life that is not answered in His Eucharistic presence. I have become more forgiving and understanding in all circumstances. When life smacks me, as it does all of us, I run to be with Him. I have the joy of feeling my faith grow, enrich and blossom, and I know that is because I have placed myself before Him, so He may work within me.

Monsignor sent me a note with some guidance which sums up everything. In it, he notes Cardinal Robert Sarah, the Vatican's most senior liturgy official, who wrote "the love that says nothing and asks nothing leads to the greater love, the silent love of God.

The silence of love is the perfect silence in the presence of God that sums up all goodness, all beauty and perfection."

So that's it—beautiful silence leads to profound communion with our Eucharistic Lord and leads us to apostleship and blesses us with the seven spiritual gifts of the Holy Spirit—wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord. How blessed we are to have this great Grace in our midst.

## **THE SUNDAY REFLECTION**

**Zephaniah 3:14-18a, Psalm Isiah 12:2-6,  
Philippians 4:4-7, & Luke 3:10-18**

**Reflection by Deacon Anthony Cincotta**

*In the fast-paced and sometimes scary world we live in, a message telling us to have no anxiety can make us stop in our tracks. No worry, we might think, "Well, what about my family, my job, our country's political situation, crime, racial tension, violence, abortion, and war." How can I not be anxious? The reading from Saint Paul's letter to the Philippians for today gives us a game plan for reducing anxiety—a textual map for us to navigate our way as we prepare for the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ.*

*Paul exclaims, "Rejoice in the Lord always, I shall say it again: rejoice!" We often lose joy when we get caught up in life, and we lose the comfort of knowing that God loves us and watches over us. We need to look for joy in prayer, God's creation, and God in the people we meet.*

**Be kind!** *Within the rush of life, we sometimes forget the power of a smile, a helpful hand, or a few kind words. The capability of a small act of kindness is that one action can reverberate, sending out ripples of kindness. Life's frustrations often make us want to lash out at others, usually at those not the cause of our frustrations. Perhaps when things aren't going to plan, it is time for a "new plan." We may then find joy when we least expect it.*


**Be thankful!** *The rush of everyday life often leaves us in a chaotic busyness. We need to accomplish our goals to create a good life for our families and ourselves. However, we can never lose sight of God. A deep breath and a whispered thanks could help ease that anxiety.*

**Pray!** *Find the peace of God to "guard your hearts and minds." Speak to God, and He will speak to you.*

*In today's Gospel narrative, friends, we get more ways to help us find our way on our map. John the Baptist tells the crowd, "Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none." John tells them to be fair and honest and to wait for the one who is coming. His advice is perfect, and it can be broadened in many ways. Today, and every day, we strive to "rejoice, be kind, be thankful, and pray" that we obtain our way to the peace of Jesus Christ, our Savior.*

**Question of the Day:** *How will you share your time, talent, and treasure with those in need?*

**Prayer:** *"Cry out with joy and gladness: for among you is the great and Holy One of Israel." (Isaiah 12)*


### NEW! ST. VINCENT DE PAUL NEWS
